- The construction industry is the **fourth largest employer** in Northern Ireland.
- The Building & Infrastructure sector is one of the largest in the UK, **employing 3.1 million people**, equivalent to 9% of the workforce.
- By 2025, the industry will need to recruit an additional **217,000 new** workers just to meet demand.

The sector is innovative, developing fresh and unique concepts, seeking to reduce costs, and aiming to boost sustainability in the supply chain. This includes implementing digital technologies, such as Virtual Reality, Augmented Reality, BIM (Building Information Modelling), 3D Visualisation, Smart Technologies, and more.

Many semi-skilled and entry level jobs in the sector require minimum qualifications and experience, where you can work your way up while gaining on-the-job experience.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS DO I NEED?



For skilled roles, such as an Electrician or Plumber, you will need an Apprenticeship and relevant NVQ Level 3 qualification.

For technical roles, such as an Architect or CAD Design Engineer, you will typically need a HND Level 5 (or equivalent) or a degree in a relevant subject.

Beyond the qualifications needed to pursue a career in the Building & Infrastructure sector, there are a range of employability skills and personal attributes that are useful to have. These include:

The Construction Industry Training Board offers a range of support, grants, and funding for employers in the sector, as well as providing training courses and qualifications for employees, trainees, and apprentices.

Construction Employers' Federation (CEF)

The Construction Employers' Federation is the primary representative for the Building & Infrastructure sector in Northern Ireland. They represent around 70% of the country's businesses and employees in the industry.

Royal Town Planning Institute

The Royal Town Planning Institute represents planners in the Building & Infrastructure sector throughout the United Kingdom and Ireland. They are responsible for the upkeep of professional standards and the accreditation of high-quality planning courses.

Electrical Training Trust (ETT)

The Electrical Training Trust provide support and training services to employers in the electrical contracting industry, including being an AM2 test centre for Electrical Installation Apprentices, and the body responsible for managing the SparkSafe Licence to Practice scheme.
